Keynote Speaker

Yonah Martin

The Honourable Yonah Martin (born April 11, 1965 in Seoul, Korea) is a Conservative Senator of British Columbia, appointed by the Right Honourable Stephen Harper in 2009. She is the first and only Parliamentarian of Korean descent in Canadian history.

Currently, she is the Deputy Leader of the Opposition in the Senate (since 2015); and previously served as Deputy Leader and Deputy Whip of the Government. She is also Co-Chair of Canada Korea Inter Parliamentary Friendship Group (since 2009), the founding Co-Chair of Canada Bulgaria (since 2014); and active on a number of other bilateral and multilateral groups. In 2013, Sen. Martin's Bill (S-213) received Royal Assent to designate July 27 annually as "Korean War Veterans Day" in Canada.

Passionate about mentoring youth and young adults, in partnership with regional community groups across Canada, she established a Parliamentary Internship and Mentoring Program (in 2011). Prior to her Senate appointment, she spent 21 years (1987-2008) as a BC educator and co-founded C3 Society in 2003. Presently, she lives in Burnaby, BC with her family.




Hotel Map

Conference Policies

PacificMUN 2019 would like to inform its participants of certain conference guidelines which conference delegates, staff and all other conference participants are expected to adhere to at all times. They are as follows:

- 1. All delegates and staff members are expected to attend all committee sessions, ceremonies and major conference events.
- 2. Delegates may be excused from committee sessions by their head delegate or sponsor teacher, but their committee staff must be notified prior to session, and notification must include their reason for absence.
- 3. Delegates are expected to be in their hotel rooms by the established curfew on Friday, February 22ndd, and Saturday, February 23rd, unless involved in PacificMUN's midnight committee sessions. Curfew and committee session timings will be established in the official conference schedule.
- 4. PacificMUN 2019 will not be offering co-educational rooming.
- 5. PacificMUN expects delegates to remain courteous and considerate towards all conference participants, including but not limited to staff, sponsor teachers, Secretariat members, and other delegates.
- All conference participants are to wear conference-issued name tags during the duration of the conference at all times. You may be asked to present your name tag in order to enter some PacificMUN events, such as opening and closing ceremonies, and the social.
- 7. If a delegate has any outstanding medical requirements or limitations that may impact their participation in the conference, they are expected to notify their delegation's primary contact, or their committee staff, in the case of an independent delegate.
- 8. The destruction or damage of property will not be tolerated, and responsibility for all cases of vandalism will be assumed by the conference participant who performed it. "Property" includes, but is not limited to all conference venue, and any property held by the conference.
- 9. If an above guideline is violated, the Secretariat of PacificMUN 2019 reserve the right to eject a delegate from the conference for a specific duration of time.
- 10. All conference participants will adhere to any set of rules or restrictions established by the conference venue: the Pinnacle Harbourfront Vancouver Hotel.
- 11. PacificMUN's code of conduct asserts that any and all actions, and objects that are illegal in the presence of minors by the municipal, provincial or national government.



12. If a minor is found to be in violation of the above guidelines, their legal parent/guardian will be notified immediately, and will be required to retrieve their child from the conference premises. The offending minor will not be allowed to return to the conference for the remainder of this year's iteration.

Dress Code

All delegates are expected to attend Pacific Model United Nations 2019 in full Western Business Attire with his or her name tag clearly displayed. For women, this would include a blouse, blazer, skirt, and or suit pants; for men, it is expected that they wear suit pants, a shirt, necktie, sweater, and vest.

Leaving Conference Premises

Delegates are not permitted to leave their respective committees or the venue of Pinnacle Harbourfront Hotel unless they have received permission from staff, Secretariat, sponsor teachers, or has been allotted during specific times such as dinner and break. Curfew for delegates has been set at 11:59 PM on Friday night and 2:30 AM Saturday night. Any delegates found after these prescribed curfews will be apprehended and prosecuted based on severity.

During dinner and breaks, delegates who choose to leave the premises are permitted to go anywhere they please with the permission and/or supervision of their Head Delegate or Sponsor Teacher. Delegates are not permitted to bring any food or drinks into committee session with the exception of water and venue provided foods and beverages. Washroom breaks are permitted and do not require permission from the Dais.

Committee Session

Delegates are expected to behave in a professional manner as representatives of their respective countries inside and outside of committee session. In the committee session, delegates are expected to speak in third person and in a professional and positive manner, under no circumstances attacking other delegates personally or speaking out of proportion. While other delegates are speaking, delegates are expected to communicate with other delegates via notes and be respectful and quiet. Upon leaving committee session, delegates are expected to keep track of all belongings, as Pacific Model United Nations is not liable for any lost or stolen items.



Electronic Policy

Delegates are allowed to use cellular devices and laptops/tablets as long as it is considered conducive to the delegate's performance in the committee. Delegates are not permitted to play games or use social media platforms with the conference's complimentary Wi-Fi. If delegates are caught abusing this privilege, it will be taken away.
